

## Cover Design Competition – SBMPv5

Living in Canberra means we get to enjoy the natural beauty that the 'bush capital' has to offer. The ACT bushland also means we need to be prepared for bushfires. The ACT Rural Fire Service (ACTRFS) review the 'Strategic Bushfire Management Plan' (known as the SBMP) every five years, to plan out how to protect and prepare the Canberra community against bushfires.

Version 5 of the SBMP is currently being created and is set to launch in early 2025, and it needs a fantastic and creative cover to go with it – a new plan needs a new look!

The ACTRFS is asking any creative and artistic ACT school students to design a new cover for the SBMP that represents the following design theme: "Shared Responsibility – we all have a role in preparing for bushfires".

A complete guide to the cover design competition can be found below. Several winners may be selected, and their design will be featured on, and within, the new plan – group entries are also welcomed.

## Design Guidelines –

Design Theme:	"Shared Responsibility – we all have a role in preparing for bushfires".
	We would love to see some creative representations of shared responsibility, in relation to preparing for and responding to bushfires.
	This can be literal and realistic, or abstract.
	Think about all the different roles that need to be played:  ACTRFS – our volunteer firefighters/first responders, our fire planners and strategic experts.  ACT Government – strategic planning support, broader community services that need to keep running even during a bushfire.  ACT Community – supporting each other, learning from the experts and staying informed, making their homes safe.  Your immediate family – making a 'survival plan' together, creating an 'emergency kit', making your house prepared.  You – what role do you play?  Other roles?
What design mediums will be	All design mediums will be accepted, as long as it can be scanned or clearly photographed when submitted.
accepted?	Mediums – painting, pencil/pen/charcoal/pastel drawings, digital/graphic design, collage, etc.
	If photography/images are featured in your design, they cannot show people's faces and must be your original images.
Design size	The design must fit in a standard A4 page size - 210mm x 297mm
