Equipment connected over the nbn™ access network will not work during a power blackout.

Make sure you have a battery powered radio and your mobile phone is fully charged.

Having an emergency kit ready to go can help you save precious time if you have to leave in a hurry.

My emergency kit has

- battery powered radio with spare batteries
- torch with spare batteries
- first aid kit
- candles and waterproof matches
- important papers including emergency contact numbers
- a copy of my Home Emergency Plans.
- waterproof bag for valuables.

If you have pets don't forget leads, food and bowls too.

Useful tips

- keep your emergency kit in a waterproof storage container
- check and restock items regularly (eg. use-by dates on batteries)
- keep a list of emergency numbers near your phone or on your fridge.
